1. What is an Interjection? (Definition)

An Interjection is a "Feeling Word"! It is a short, exciting word that shows sudden feelings like happiness, sadness, anger, or surprise.

- **The Golden Rule:** Interjections always use an Exclamation Mark (!) right after them.

2. The Interjection Chart (Types & Examples)

Feeling	Interjection Word	Easy Example Sentences
Happiness & Joy	Wow! / Yay!	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Yay! We won the game! • Wow! This painting is beautiful!
Sadness	Oh no! / Alas!	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Oh no! My toy is broken. • Alas! The ice cream dropped.
Surprise	Oh! / Ah!	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Oh! I did not see you there. • Ah! Now I understand.
Pain or Hurt	Ouch!	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Ouch! The sharp pin hurt my finger.
Silence	Shh!	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Shh! The baby is sleeping.
Disgust (Yucky things)	Yuck!	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Yuck! This mud is sticky and dirty.

Examples

- **Wow!** That rocket launched so high into space.
- **Ouch!** A sharp bee stung my little ankle.
- **Yay!** We are going to the amusement park.
- **Oh no!** The milk spilled all over the counter.
- **Shh!** Talk softly so you do not disturb anyone.
- **Alas!** The old beautiful castle fell down today.
- **Yuck!** This old food tastes completely spoiled.
